## Aloha mai kākou,

**HE NO‘ONO‘O ‘O BERNICE PAUHI BISHOP** no ka wā e hiki mai ana. Ua ‘ike ‘o ia—‘ane‘ane piha 140 makahiki aku nei—e pi‘i ka mana o nā ‘Ōiwi Hawai‘i i ka ho‘ona‘auao ‘ia ‘ana e puka pono a lilo he po‘e alaka‘i, ma Hawai‘i nei a ā puni ho‘i ke ao.

Ma ke ‘ano he kahu o ka ‘āina a me ka ho‘oilina o Pauahi, ua ho‘ohiki mākou e ho‘omau i ka mea a Pauahi i ‘īini ai no ko kākou lāhui. Hana mākou penei ma ka noke ‘ana i ka ho‘okō i ko kākou mikiona: ‘o ia ka hana ‘ana i nā ala no ka wā mau loa e hō‘oi ‘ia ai ka mea e kū‘ono‘ono ai ka noho ‘ana o nā kānaka koko Hawai‘i. Ua alaka‘i ‘ia nō ho‘i kākou e kekahi kumumana‘o (SP2020) a me ka Vision 2040, kahi i kuhi ‘ia ai he lāhui māhūahua e pi‘i ai ka holomua o nā haumāna ‘Ōiwi Hawai‘i i ke au e hiki mai ana.

I ka nānā ‘ana i ka wā e hiki mai ana, ‘ike ‘ia ka hō‘oi ‘ia ‘ana o nā hana like ‘ole, ‘o ka hopena, ‘o ka loli ma waena o ka lāhui kanaka, ka ho‘oponopono ‘āina, a me nā ‘Ōiwi Hawai‘i e kōkua ana i ka holomua o ko Hawai‘i nei a me nā wahi ā puni ke ao.

**BERNICE PAUHI BISHOP** was a visionary woman. She saw – more than 130 years ago – that education would empower Native Hawaiians to be successful and to rise up as leaders, both in Hawai‘i and globally.

## Bridging the Gaps

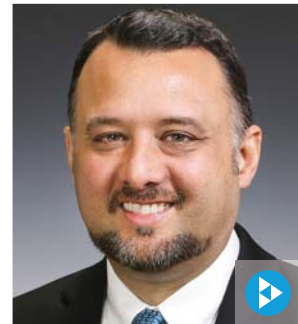
**H**E NUI NŌ NĀ LIMA nāna e hānai i ke keiki, a ma Hāna, ua laulima pū nā kumu a’o e ho’opihapiha ai i nā hana e pono ai ka hānai ‘ana i nā kamali’i ‘ōpio pio loa e hele nei i ke kula. Ma ka 2017, ua hui like ke Kula Kamehameha, ke Kula Kī’eki’e a me ke Kula Ha’aha’a o Hāna, ka Pūnana Leo o Hāna, a me Hale Hi’ipoi, a kapa ‘ia kēia hui ‘ana ‘o Nā Maka Kilo o Hāna. Ua hālāwai kūkā nā lālā i kēlā makahiki aku nei e ho’ākāka ai i nā mea a me nā hana e pono ai no ka ho’ona’auao ‘ana i nā kamali’i. Ma kēia kui lima pū ‘ana, hiki nō i nā kumu o Hāna ke ho’omākaukau pono i nā kamali’i no ke kula ha’aha’a me ka holomua hou

aku. Nui nō ka ha’aeheo o ke Kula Kamehameha i ka laulima pū ma ka hana!

**IT TAKES MANY HANDS** to raise a keiki, and in Hāna, the spirit of laulima has early childhood educators working together to close the gaps for its youngest learners. In 2017, Kamehameha Schools, along with Hāna High and Elementary School, Pūnana Leo o Hāna, and Hale Hi’ipoi, formed a hui called Nā Maka Kilo o Hāna. Members met last year to identify needs and opportunities in education and childcare. With joined hands, Hāna’s kumu can better prepare its keiki for elementary school and beyond, and Kamehameha Schools is proud to ho’olaulima.

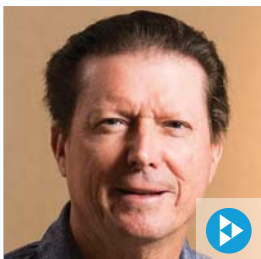

# Ke Kanu ‘Ano‘ano

## Planting a Seed

**H**E MEA NUI LOA ke kula kama iki i ka ulu ‘ana o ke kama iki, akā, he nui nō nā ‘ohana e pilikia nei i ka mea e hiki

ai ke uku no ke kākau inoa ‘ana. Ma kua‘āina i Kohala, ua wehe ‘ia kekahi kula kama iki i ka makahiki 2017, a ua kōkua ‘ia kona wehe ‘ana ma o kekahi ha‘awina kālā na ke Kula Kamehameha e pono ai ke kaiāulu.

Na kēia ha‘awina kālā i ho‘olako i ke kālā e pono ai ka wehe ‘ana i ka papa kula kama iki mua loa a pēlā i kōkua ‘ia ai ia kula i kona noi ‘ana no ke kākō‘o ho‘omau ma o ke ke‘ena Executive Office on Early Learning nāna e ho‘omalua i nā kula kama iki ‘umi kumamāiwa kula kama iki aupuni uku ‘ole. I kēlā makahiki aku nei, ‘o ke Kula Ha‘aha‘a o Kohala kekahi o nā wahi hou ‘elima ma lalo o ka ‘Oihana Ho‘ona‘auao i wae ‘ia ai no ka ho‘olako ‘ia i ke kālā.

He nū hou hau‘oli nō ho‘i kēia iā Paris Nicoll, he makuahine o ‘ekolu po‘e keiki a aia kāna keiki kāne hānau mua i loko o ka polokalamu. “Ke ho‘omākaukau ‘ia maila ‘o ia no mua iho i kona ola ‘ana, he nui loa nō ko mākou mahalo.”

**PRESCHOOL IS ESSENTIAL** to a child’s development, yet for many families, a shortage of affordable options stands in the way of enrollment. In the remote community of Kohala, a free public preschool opened in 2017, and it launched with the help of a Kamehameha Schools community investment grant.

The grant provided the seed funding Kohala Elementary School needed to open its first pre-kindergarten class and made it a strong candidate for continued support through the Executive Office on Early Learning, which oversees the state’s 19 free public preschools. Last year, Kohala Elementary was one of five new DOE sites to be selected for public funding.

It’s welcome news for Paris Nicoll, a mother of three whose eldest son, Zyan, is now in the program. “It’s preparing him for the next stage of life, that’s definitely something we’re very grateful for.”

'ia kēlā me kēia 'ao'ao o ka holo nui i nā mauna poni 'āhiehie me nā kukuna mālamalama he nui. Puapua'i ka wai mai loko mai o nā hue wai ā helele'i he koku līpine uliuli. Ulu nā kalo 'ākala nunui ma ka papahale.

'O kēia ki'i paia i pena 'ia ka hana a ka mea hana no'eau, 'o John "Prime" Hina a me nā mea ma'i 'ōpio o ka Family Treatment Center, kahi e lapa'au 'ia nei nā keiki li'ili'i me nā 'ōpio, he po'e koko Hawai'i nā mea nui o lākou, no nā pilikia o ka ha'awina o ka na'au a me ka hana 'ana. He hua kēia ku'ikahi ma muli o ke alu like 'ana o ke Kula Kamehameha a me ke Queen's Native Hawaiian Health Program.

No nā makahiki 'elua i hala aku nei, ua hana pū 'o Prime a me kāna po'e alaka'i me ka po'e limahana e ho'ohuihui i nā hana ku'una a me nā 'ano hana ho'ohoihoi a ka po'e 'ōpio i loko o nā hana e lapa'au ai i nā 'ōpio. Ma kēia alu like 'ana, ua pena lākou i ka holo, ke ke'ena ho'olulu, a me 'umi mau lumi mea ma'i, kahi e hō'ike'ike 'ia ai nā ha'awina ku'una Hawai'i e like me ke kuleana a me ke ahonui. Ua 'ike 'o Prime i ka loli 'ana o kāna po'e haumāna i loko o kā lākou mau hana i ka pena i nā ki'i niniu o nā waiho'olu'u like 'ole e uhi nei i nā paia manakā i ka wā ma mua. "Makemake mākou iā lākou e mana'o ua noa lākou," wahi āna, "pēlā e ho'omaka ai ke ola hou 'ana."

**WHEN YOU ENTER** the Family Treatment Center at The Queen's Medical Center, you're greeted with vibrant walls of color. Both sides of its central hall are painted with lavender mountains bathed in golden light. Water pours from calabashes into a ribbon of turquoise. Giant pink kalo sprout from the floor.

The mural is the work of graffiti artist John "Prime" Hina and the young patients at the Family Treatment Center, where children and teens, many of them Native Hawaiian, receive care for emotional and behavioral issues. Their collaboration is the result of a partnership between Kamehameha Schools and Queen's Native Hawaiian Health Program.

For the past two years, Hina and his alaka'i have worked closely with staff to integrate cultural practices and creative expression into the youths' therapy sessions. Together, they've painted the hall, lobby, and 10 patient rooms, where Hawaiian values like kuleana and ahonui provide the theme. Hina has seen his students' transformations reflected in the bright swirls of color that now cover the once drab beige walls. "We want them to be in that space where they feel free," he explains, "that's when the healing can begin."

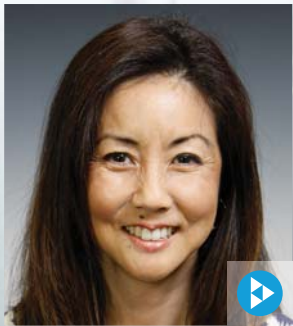

# He Hālau Paia ‘A‘ala

## Teaching Outside the Walls

**U** A A‘O ‘O KUMU Joel Truesdell i ka hana kemi-ka ma ke Kula Kamehameha he ‘ane‘ane piha kanakolu makahiki, a i loko o ia wā, ua lilo ‘o ia kekahi o ka po‘e alaka‘i ma ka ho‘ona‘auao ‘ana me ka ho‘ohana pū i nā hana ku‘una a ka po‘e Hawai‘i. I kēlā makahiki aku nei, ua makana ‘ia ‘o ia i ka ha‘awina kālā hanohano, ‘o ka Shell Science Teaching Award no ka National Science Teachers Association no kāna mau hana a‘o akamai loa.

Ma ka ho‘ona‘auao hana ku‘una, komo pū nā haumāna i ka hana ma ka ‘āina me ka ho‘opa‘a pū i nā ‘ike ku‘una like ‘ole i pili ai ke kumuhana i ka po‘e haumāna. ‘O kekahi ‘ao‘ao o ke a‘o ‘ana o Kumu Truesdell, ‘o ia ka ho‘opa‘a ‘ana o nā haumāna o ka papa kemika ho‘omākaukau kulanui i ka hana e ho‘ōla hou ai i ka ulu koa.

He hō‘ike‘ike kāna makana i ke ohohia e ulu nei no nā ‘ano papa hana ku‘una me ke kōkua pū o ke a‘o ‘ana o nā kumu i nā kumu ‘ē a‘e. Ua loa‘a iā Joel Truesdell he kumu ho‘ohālike, ‘o Dr. Walter Kahumoku, he kumu a‘o ha‘i‘ōlelo o ka wā ma mua ma ke KS a ‘o ia kekahi o ka po‘e mua nāna i ho‘ohui i nā hana ku‘una i loko o ka ho‘ona‘auao ‘ana. Ke nīnau ‘ia ‘o Dr.

Kahumoku i ke kumu o ka mea nui o ka hō‘ike‘ike ‘ana i nā kumu ‘ē a‘e i kēia mau hana a‘o, he ma‘alahi kāna ha‘ina: “No ka mea, hana pono kēia mau hana.”

**KUMU JOEL TRUESDELL** has taught chemistry at Kamehameha Schools for almost 30 years, and in that time, he has become a leading practitioner of culture-based education. Last year, he received the prestigious Shell Science Teaching Award from the National Science Teachers Association for his innovative methods.

A culture-based curriculum incorporates ‘āina, along with Hawaiian knowledge and practices, to engage students and help make the subject matter relevant. Truesdell’s students, for example, learn college-prep chemistry in the process of restoring a koa forest.

His award reflects a growing enthusiasm for culture-based methods, aided in part by kumu teaching other kumu. Truesdell found a mentor in Dr. Walter Kahumoku, a former speech teacher at KS Kapālama and early adopter of culture in the classroom. Ask Kahumoku why it’s important to introduce other kumu to these approaches, and his answer is simple: “Because they work.”

## FORWARDING OUR MISSION

Fiscal year 2017 marks the halfway point in Kamehameha Schools' Strategic Plan 2015-2020 (SP2020), the first in a series of strategic plans that will bring transformative change across the lāhui within a generation; our financial and land assets play a key role in this effort. Through careful management of these assets, our organization is able to advance its mission, and in 2017, we continued to make great progress towards SP2020's central objective: to significantly increase the success rate of Native Hawaiians in college, career, and leadership pursuits.

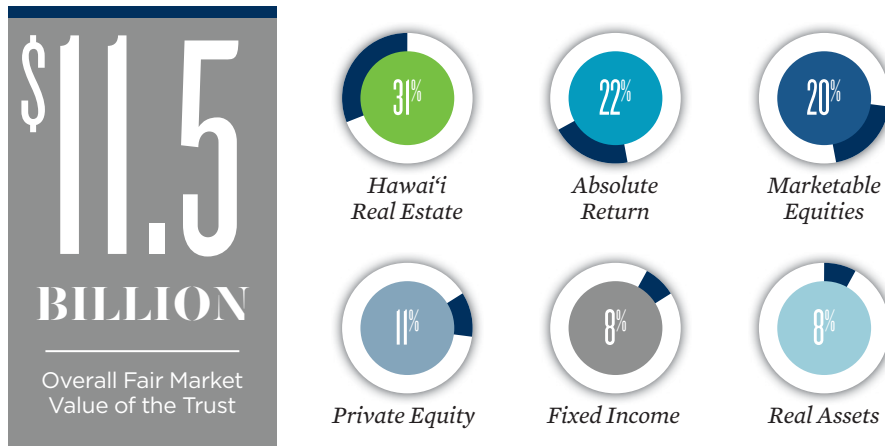

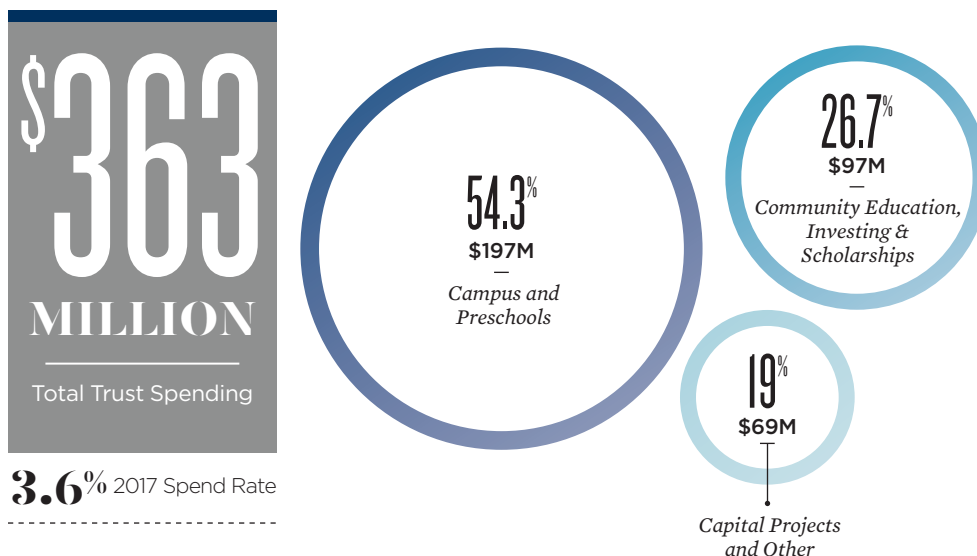
## KAMEHAMEHA SCHOOLS TRUST

► Kamehameha Schools' mission is primarily supported by its endowment. The endowment was valued at \$11.5 billion as of June 30, 2017. A globally diversified financial assets portfolio of \$8.0 billion, and Hawai'i real estate representing \$3.5 billion at fair market value comprise the endowment's value.



## KAMEHAMEHA SCHOOLS TRUST SPENDING

► For this fiscal year, Kamehameha Schools had a total educational spend of \$363 million, which is equal to a 3.6 percent spend rate for this year. The average spend rate was 3.8 percent for the last five years and 3.7 percent for last 10 years. Educational spend consists of \$197 million on campus-based programs, \$97 million on scholarships and community-focused programs, and \$69 million on other educational costs primarily capital, debt financing, and support services.



**Kamehameha Schools** is a private charitable educational trust endowed by the will of Hawaiian Princess Bernice Pauahi Bishop (1831-1884), the great-granddaughter and last direct descendant of King Kamehameha I.

During her lifetime, Princess Pauahi witnessed the rapid decline of the Native Hawaiian population. She knew that education would be key to the survival of her people, and in an enduring act of aloha, she bequeathed to them a precious gift – 375,000 acres of ancestral lands of the royal Kamehameha family and instructions to her trustees that the “rest, residue and remainder of my estate” be used to establish the Kamehameha Schools.

Today, as it has for the past 130 years, Ke Ali'i Pauahi's legacy continues to advance her desire to restore the well-being of her people.



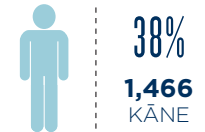
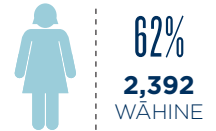
# ► Endowment

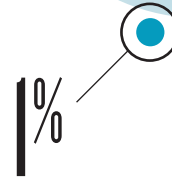

These partnerships have given us really good intelligence about how to prepare and support our students better. **LAST SEPTEMBER** marked the second anniversary of a partnership between Kamehameha Schools and the University of Hawai'i called Hui Ho'opili 'Āina. What began as a mutual commitment to promote Native Hawaiian student success, mālama 'āina, and Hawaiian language and knowledge is coming into focus with the rollout of several exciting initiatives.

One is a dual-credit program, in which KS, Hawaiian charter, and immersion school students

can earn college credits through the UH system. Another is Makalapua Na'auao, a UH scholarship that combines four years of financial aid with academic and career support. And not far out is the aloha 'āina degree pathway, currently in development under UH West O'ahu's Sustainable Community Food Systems program.

**IT'S AN EXCITING CHAPTER** in the story of Kaka'ako. Construction's winding down on key projects, and a community's on the rise as residents like James Ka and Lezlie Kiaha, both Kamehameha Schools alumni, make a home in Kaka'ako.

Ka is a first-time homeowner who returned to Honolulu in 2012 after more than a decade in Los Angeles. Three years into building his own business, he managed to qualify for one of the 85 affordable units at

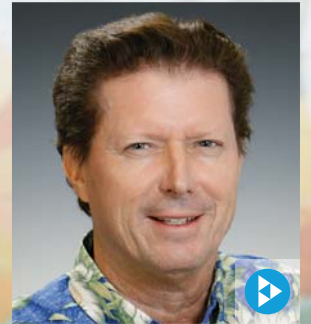
Keauhou Place, the newest of the KS properties, which opened last year. From his corner unit on the 27th floor, life is settling into a nice routine: coffee on the lānai before heading to the office just three blocks away.

Kiaha is a former graphic designer and recent law school graduate. She lives in the Flats at Pu'unui, a KS rental development where all 88 units are reserved for middle income earners. "Living down here and working as a young professional, it's inspiring," Kiaha says. It's close to the courts where she'll work and surrounded by a buzzy art and music scene that feeds her creative side. "I can't see myself anywhere else right now."

## Embracing Culture in the Workplace

‘O ka waiwai o nā ‘ano papa hana e like me ‘Ōlelo Kahua, ‘o ka lawe a ho‘ohana ‘ana o ko mākou po‘e limahana ma ka hale a me ke kaiāulu. I loko o kona mau makahiki he ‘umi ma ke KS, mana‘o ‘o Shawna Medeiros ua ‘oi loa a‘e ka laha o nā hana ku‘una ma kona wahi hana i kēia wā ma mua o kekahi wā ma mua. He ho‘iho‘i nō ‘o ia i kēlā ‘ano ‘ike mai kona wahi hana aku a ho‘ā‘o ma ka hale me kāna kaikamahine, ‘o Kamaha‘o, he haumāna ma ke kula, ‘o Hālau Kū Māna. “‘O kona ‘ike i nā hana ku‘una kona hōkū pa‘a,” wahi a Shawna. Inā ‘o ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i, ke kūkulu pilina, a i ‘ole ka hele i ka huaka‘i ka mea i nānā ‘ia, ke ho‘olako ‘ia nā limahana i ka mea e a‘o ai i nā hana ku‘una, he paipai nō ho‘i lākou i ka laha ‘ana o nā hana ku‘una ma waena o ka lāhui.

**IN 2017**, Kamehameha Schools completed the rollout of one of its largest professional development initiatives: ‘Ōlelo Kahua, a series of Hawaiian language classes

for employees. All regular staff members attend one two-hour session each month, with the goal of increasing ‘Ōlelo Hawai‘i’s use. Each lesson brings a deeper understanding of Hawaiian values, knowledge, history, and practices. So not only is language proficiency improving among staff, kuana‘ike Hawai‘i (Hawaiian perspective) is as well, and that’s a powerful source of ideas and innovation.

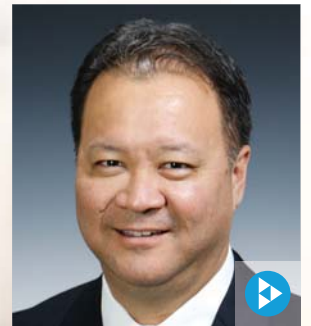
The benefit of programs like ‘Ōlelo Kahua is that employees can take what they learn and practice it at home and in their communities. In her 10 years at KS, Shawna Medeiros said she believes that the presence of culture in the workplace has never been stronger. She’s able to take that ‘ike (knowledge) and share it with her daughter Kamaha‘o, a student at Hālau Kū Māna, at home. “Her cultural grounding is her hōkūpa‘a, her north star,” Medeiros says. Whether it’s practicing ‘ōlelo (language), building pilina (relationships), or going on huaka‘i (excursions), providing cultural education opportunities for our employees help drive cultural vibrancy across the lāhui.





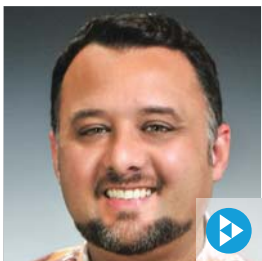

## Reviving What Was Lost

Kamehameha, a 'o ka ho'omalū 'ana kekahi o nā mana'o ko'iko'i loa mai ka wā ma mua loa mai. I kēlā makahiki aku nei, ua ho'okō mākou i ko mākou kuleana ma ka ho'okumu 'ana i kekahi 'Aelike Awa Palekana i pūlima 'ia me ka DLNR a me ka U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Ma loko o nā 'ano 'Aelike Awa Palekana like 'ole, na kekahi 'ona 'āina e 'ae manawale'a i ka ho'okō i nā hana e ho'omalū ai i nā lāhui mea ola kūlana kānalua a weli-weli paha. Ma loko o kēia 'aelike, ho'omalū 'ia 32,280 'eka 'āina ma Ka'ū, a ma o ka ho'ōla lāhui mea ola a me nā hana ho'omalū like 'ole, ke hana nei mākou e hō'āwīwi aku i ka ho'opakele 'ia 'ana o 'ehiku mau lāhui manu 'ōiwi, 25 mau 'ano lāhui mea ulu, a me ka 'ōpe'ape'a pū kekahi.

'O kekahi mea waiwai nui, 'o ia ka 'alalā, ka lāhui manu 'alalā 'ōiwi i 'ane'ane e pau loa a 'a'ole i 'ike 'ia ma ke ākea no 'ane'ane piha iwakālua mau makahiki. Ma hope o nā makahiki ma ka ho'omākaukau pono 'ana, ke mana'o nei ka po'e ho'opa'a akeakamai 'akahi nō a mākaukau ka 'āina no ka ho'i hou 'ana o ka 'alalā. Ua kūkulu 'ia he pa

ā puni ka 'āpana 'āina a wehe 'ia nā holoholona po'i, ua ulu nā mea ulu ho'omalumalu papakū, a ua ulu hou nā kumu mea'ai. He mo'olelo pōmaika'i loa kēia a ma'alahi ka ha'awina: aia ke ola i ka 'āina māhuhua pono.

SOME OF HAWAII'S LAST reserves of intact native forest are found on Kamehameha Schools' lands, and their preservation has long been a priority. Last year, Kamehameha Schools made its kuleana pa'a with the adoption of a Safe Harbor Agreement, signed along with DLNR and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

In any Safe Harbor Agreement, a private landowner voluntarily agrees to undertake actions that protect threatened or endangered species. This particular agreement covers 32,280 acres of land in Ka'ū where, through habitat restoration and other management practices, we're working to accelerate the recovery of seven native bird species, 25 plant species, and the 'ōpe'ape'a (Hawaiian hoary bat).

Of special significance is the 'alalā, a species of native crow that nearly went extinct and hasn't existed in the wild for nearly two decades. After years of careful preparation, scientists believe the 'āina is finally ready

for the 'alalā's return. The land has been fenced and cleared of introduced predators, a protective understory has grown in, and food sources have returned.

It's a remarkable story with a simple lesson: everyone thrives in a healthy ecosystem.

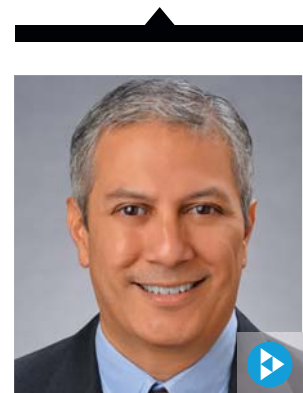

# Imua nā haumāna

## 2016-2017 SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

**T**he Pauahi Foundation disbursed over \$700,000 in scholarships to over 200 Native Hawaiian learners last fiscal year. Recipients ranged from high school seniors from Kamehameha Schools and other private and public high schools to current college students. A pleasant surprise was the number of non-traditional students who are now seeking the opportunity to get a college education after taking a break from school.

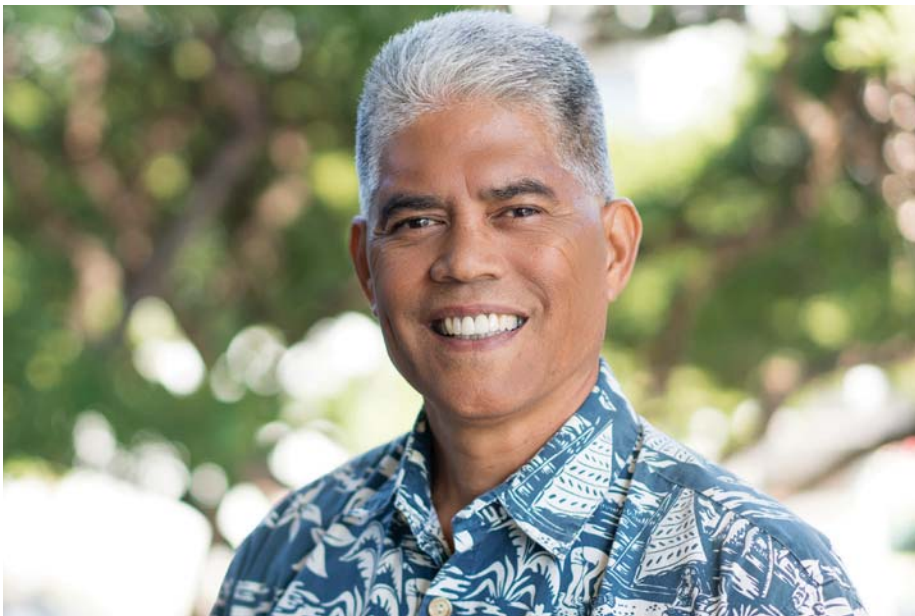

## DUANE KSK'72 AND BETTE CHUN

GLADYS E. AND CLIFFORD T.F. CHUN SCHOLARSHIP

**WHEN THE TIME CAME** for Duane and Bette Chun to finance their daughter's college education, their options were limited. Together, they earned more than need-based scholarships would allow but not enough to cover the full cost of tuition. After experiencing this all too common dilemma, the Chuns approached the Pauahi Foundation and established a fund that would help other families in their situation. For six years, they made periodic donations, matched by First Hawaiian Bank's matching gift program, and in 2014, they awarded their first scholarships. Named after Duane's parents, the scholarship honors their love of education and serves as that "last hope" when a family's options fall short.

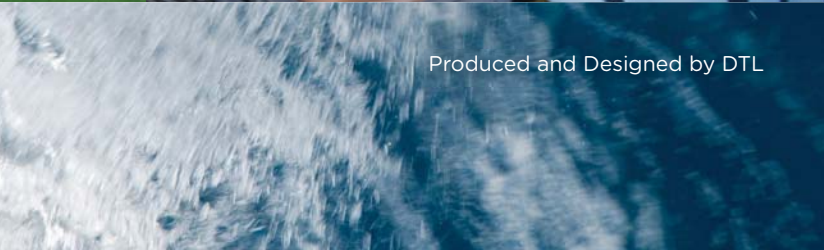
