Abstract: This collection contains about 135 linear feet or 274 grey archival boxes of papers from Dr. Midkiff's tenure as President and Trustee of Kamehameha Schools from 1923-1983. Additionally, 198 awards and honors are described. An influential Twentieth Century person, he received numerous awards, citations, accolades and honors.

Acquisitions Information

The Midkiff Learning Center was built at the Diamond Head end of Konia field at the Kapālama campus in 1977 and named after Dr. Midkiff in his honor. He was a Trustee of the Schools at that time. A room called The Frank E. Midkiff Papers contains his life's work and awards. His wife, Marjorie, supervised the furnishing of the room. Awards and photographs filled the Diamond Head side of the room. Glass front koa cases were provided for Samoan artifacts, other awards and memorabilia. He may have begun to deposit his papers beginning in 1977.

Processing Information

Lela Goodell, a contract archivist, was hired to process the Midkiff papers. She completed her work on April 30, 1998. The Kamehameha Schools Archives opened in 1992 in the same room and accommodated to the given environment.

In 2008, Candace W. Lee, the Assistant Archivist, wrote the biographical highlights, photographed, measured and processed the awards and artifacts and created an illustrated, annotated inventory. As a result of these additions, the name of the collection is changed from the Frank E. Midkiff Papers to the Frank E. Midkiff Collection. The Finding Aid was not completed for various reasons until 2013.

PART 1

Frank Elbert Midkiff 1887-1983

Biographical Highlights

November 15, 1887

Frank Elbert Midkiff was born in Anna, Illinois to Reverend James Jesse and Bertha Wilson Midkiff He was the fourth of nine children. His mother died when he was 12 years old.

1905

In 1905, Frank graduated from Stonnington High School in Illinois and attended Shurtleff Academy and College in Upper Alton, Illinois.

1907

Frank was a laborer at Yellowstone National Park. He also worked as a foreman at Kimberley Gold Mine in Jardine, Montana in charge of running ore through Huntington Mill.

1908-10

To earn money between his junior and senior years at Colgate University, Frank was the principal, the teacher of physics, chemistry, biology, and agriculture and the coach of sports teams at Lewistown High School in Lewistown, Illinois.

1911-1912

Frank taught chemistry, biology and Robert's Rules of Order at Colgate Academy.

1912

Frank graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Colgate University with an A.B. in Geology.

1912 - 1913

After graduating from Colgate University, Frank taught English and was the coach of baseball and football at Peddie Institute in Hightstown, New Jersey. After the school year, he decided to see the world. He would support himself by working at each destination. Honolulu, Hawai'i was the first stop on his journey to Constantinople, now Istanbul, Turkey.

1913 - 1918

From ages 26 to 29, Frank took a position at O'ahu College, now Punahou School. He taught English, mathematics, physiography and parliamentary law. In

addition, he was the Athletic Director for boys. As coach of the football team, he won five football championships. He also coached basketball, baseball and track. He was the head of Rice Hall, the boys' dormitory.

Frank was a lifetime member of Central Union Church in Honolulu. He sang in the choir, was a Sunday School teacher, a Moderator, a Deacon, a Trustee and a President of the Board of Trustees.

While at O'ahu College, Frank founded their JROTC program. He attended the Civilian Officer's Training School in Monterey, California

1917

Company "D," the first company of American citizens of Japanese ancestry in Hawai'i had Frank as one of its organizers.

Prior to World War I, Frank E. Midkiff joined a company of National Guardsmen and assisted in organizing the first company of American citizens of Japanese ancestry - Company "D" of the Hawaii National Guard. Mr. Midkiff is in the front row, left.

1917

Frank, a First Lieutenant in the Hawai'i National Guard, was a coach and captain of the championship Hawai'i National Guard football team.

Frank married Ruth Richards on June 29, 1917. Ruth was the daughter of Theodore Richards, the second principal of Kamehameha Schools from 1893-1898.

The Midkiff children are Mary Wilson, Robert Richards, and Frances Elizabeth.

1918

During World War I, Frank rose to the rank of Captain

of Infantry, Regimental Adjutant, U.S. Army during World War I. His military activities increased and from 1918 to 1919, he was Officer in Charge of the Fourth Officers' Training School at Schofield



Barracks, Territory of Hawai'i. He was Captain of "M" Company of American citizens of Filipino ancestry and Post Adjutant after the Armistice of World War I.

As a civilian, Frank was Chairman of the Territory of Hawai'i Full Employment Commission until 1923. He was a member of the Pacific War Memorial Commission and its President from 1918-28



1919

Frank received an honorable discharge from the U.S. Army in August. He received "The Great War for Civilization, U.S. Army, WWI" medal.

Frank was a co-founder and charter member of the American Legion, Post No. 1 in Hawai'i.

Frank was Chairman of the Department of Hawai'i Americanization Committee to aide the formation of the Society of American Citizens of Japanese ancestry.

Frank was chairman of the First Charter Revision Commission for the City of Honolulu.

Frank was employed by Lewers & Cooke, Ltd. until 1923 as its neighbor island representative.

1923 - 1934

From the ages of 36 to 47, Frank became the President of The Kamehameha Schools.

Frank was a Trustee of Bishop Memorial Church of The Kamehameha Schools.

1924

Frank was invited to join the Social Science Association of Honolulu, a study group of the best and brightest minds in the Islands that continues today. He was secretary for seven years and president for one year. He wrote sixteen essays from 1925 – 1978.

1928 - 1931

Frank was President of the University Club.



FREDERIC DUCLOS BARSTOW

1928 - 1982

Frank was Vice-Chairman and Secretary (1931-52) and Chairman (1952-82) of the Permanent Committee of the Frederic Duclos Barstow Foundation which promotes the education of American Samoans

His adventure began when Mr. and Mrs. William Barstow appeared in his office quite unexpectedly. Their son, Frederic, arrived in Honolulu from American Samoa where he spent several years recovering from tuberculosis.

Only a few hours after reuniting with his parents who had come via steamship from New York, Frederic dropped dead from a heart attack.

His broken-hearted parents were taken to see Frank E. Midkiff who had a reputation for helping those in difficult circumstances. The Barstows asked Frank to find a way to thank the Samoans for their kindness to their son.

Frank learned that the Samoans needed a modern school system and reported this to the Barstows. They established a million dollar educational foundation which Frank was asked to administer.



To this day, Frank E. Midkiff is a hero to American Samoans. He was the only non-Samoan living outside of American Samoa to have been appointed a "High Talking Chief." In 1932, he became the Honorary High Chief Ao'e'e of Tau District in Manu'a, American Samoa.

1929

Frank and John Wise wrote the *Textbook in Hawaiian Languag*e, used at Kamehameha Schools and the University of Hawai'i.

1931

Mary, Frank's three year old daughter, died from diphtheria. Grief found a constructive voice as he lobbied the Territorial legislature for passage of a law requiring infant immunization against diphtheria. Committed to this cause, he served as a member of the Territorial Board of Health for seven years.

1932

At the age of 45, Frank received an honorary degree from Francoise M.D. Barstow and William Barstow who called him the Benefactor of American Samoa.

1933

Frank resigned from his position as President of Kamehameha to matriculate at Yale University for his Ph.D. in Education. He received his doctorate in 1935.

1934

In Hawai'i, Frank promoted the Community Association movement. He organized the first Community Association of Hawai'i at Waialua. He was the Founder and Director of the Community Associations of Hawai'i (1934-40), and was a Life Member of the Board of Trustees for the Community Associations in Hawai'i until 1958.

With interest and commitment in the Pacific region, Frank became President of the Institute of Pacific Relations, Hawai'i Council

Frank's wife, Ruth, was the granddaughter of J.B. Atherton (1837-1903), a prominent financier who arrived in Hawai'i in 1858 and became President of Castle & Cooke, Ltd. Frank was the Treasurer (1934-1945) of the J.B. Atherton Estate and the Juliette M. Atherton Trust.

1935

Frank published numerous articles and books: *The Economic Determinants of Education in Hawaii, Survey of Education in American Samoa, The Modern Educational Curriculum (co-author), The Kamehameha Schools / Bishop Estate 75th Anniversary Lecture, and Ancient Hawaiian Civilization* (co-editor). He wrote numerous articles for professional journals.



Frank was Chairman of the Committee on New Industries. He was Director, Officer, and President (1935-45) of the Chamber of Commerce of Honolulu.

1936 - 1946

Frank was appointed the Royal Danish Consul at Honolulu.

1939 - 1983

Beginning on June 8, 1939, Frank was a Trustee of The Kamehameha Schools/ Bernice Pauahi Bishop Estate until shortly before his death in 1983.

1939

Frank was a Trustee of the Charles R. Bishop Trust.

Frank was a Trustee and a President of the Board of the Bernice P. Bishop Museum until 1975 when he became an Honorary Trustee and Life Member of the Bernice P. Bishop Museum.

Interested in government affairs, Frank began his tenure as a member of the Territorial Planning Board.

1940 - 1983

Punahou School invited Frank to become a Trustee.

1941

During World War II, Frank was an organizer of the Disaster Relief Commission, the forerunner of the Office of Civilian Defense.

1943

Frank was Chairman of the Military Affairs Committee, the renewed activity of the Navy League in Hawai'i. He was Chairman of the Civilian Affairs Committee and Founder of the Pacific War Memorial Commission.

As a member of the Honolulu Chamber of Commerce, Frank was President during this year. He founded the Kōkua Council. He was Chairman of the Public Health Advisory Committee

1946

Frank was Secretary of the Territory of Hawai'i Post War Planning Commission.

Frank's civic responsibilities continued as a member of the Territory of Hawai'i Full Employment Commission until 1948.

Frank was a Trustee of Kuakini Hospital, chairman of the Kuakini Hospital's first fund drive and chairman of Kuakini Hospital's Building and Grounds Committee.

1947

At the age of 60, Frank became the Chairman of the American Battle Monuments Commission.

Frank was re-appointed Honorary Royal Danish Consul in Hawai'i until 1957.

1949

Frank was a charter member of the Pacific War Memorial Commission created by the Territorial legislature in 1949 and dissolved in 1981 by the State legislature.

1952 - 1955

Frank was a member of the U.S. Loyalty Review Board created by President Harry S. Truman.

1953 - 1954

Frank became the U.S. High Commissioner of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands appointed by President Dwight D. Eisenhower. This position gave him a seat at the United Nations as a Special Representative.

1956

Frank wrote the book, *Frederic Duclos Barstow Foundation for American Samoans – 1931 – 56.*

1957

Frank received the Order of Ke Ali'i Pauahi, the highest honor given by the Kamehameha Schools to individuals who have made extraordinary lifetime contributions to Kamehameha Schools and to the community and who exemplify the values and vision of Princess Bernice Pauahi Bishop.



1958

Frank wa<mark>s</mark> decorated a Knight of Dannebrog by King Frederick IX of Denmark on May 28, 1958. A grand ceremony was held in Denmark.





During the same year, Frank added the Downtown Improvement Association to his list of civic activities. He was a member and a director.



Frank was the founder of the Honolulu Group of International Christian Leadership.

1960

Frank received a Certificate and Statement of Appreciation for Patriotic Civilian Service from the Department of the Army.

1961

Frank encouraged Hawaiian scholars by becoming a charter sponsor of Na Poki'i.

1963

At the age of 76, after about 40 years of involvement with the military, he received the Outstanding Civilian Service Medal from the U.S. Army.





Frank was a member and director of the O'ahu Development Council and was on the Executive committee until 1967.

At the age of 76, Frank, the golfer, shot a 76 at the O'ahu Country Club.

1964

The Chamber of Commerce of Honolulu honored Frank as their Father of the Year.





Frank amassed military honors as:

- Life Member of the Association of the U.S. Army, Washington D.C.
- Honorary Chairman of the Army Advisory Committee
- Member of the Civilian Advisory Group, U.S. Army
- Member of the U.S. Air Force Association

The Emperor of Japan conferred upon Frank the Order of the Sacred Treasure, the highest honor given to a non-Japanese for his years of dedicated service.

The Order of the Splintered Paddle emerges from one of the best known laws of King Kamehameha I, the Mamalahoe Kanawai of 1797, often referred to as the Magna Charta of Hawaii. It originated according to the following legend:

While plundering off the Puna coast of the Island of Hawaii as a young man, Kamehameha skirmished with two fishermen. During the encounter, his foot slipped into a crevice of lava rock and held him fast. For the first and only time in his life, he found himself helpless. One of the fishermen, seeing his helplessness, struck him on the head with a canoe paidle so hard that the paidle splintered. Kamehameha eventually escaped.

Years later, after he became King of the Islands of Hawaii, he conducted an extensive search for the two fishermen and d them. Although they admitted their kamehameha decreed they should be d. He issued a mandate, however: teforth, any wanton attack on the cent or the helpless would be punished eath. Thus the Law of the Splintered le came into history—the first recogn of human rights for Hawaii's people. In translated, it reads: "Oh people, respect the gods—respect the big man, The small man, and let the aged men and women, and the children, Walk the highways and sleep by the wayside. No one will molest them. Death, the penalty."

The Order of the Splintered Paddle is presented to persons who have made major contributions to the welfare of the State of Hawaii. Recommendations are made to the Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii by its Awards Committee. This committee is composed of the Covernor of Hawaii, the Mayor of Honolulu, the Chairman of the Board and President of the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii.

The Awards Committee feels that those who have expressed the spirit of the proclamation of Kamehameha the Great in their daily lives, and in the contributions they have made to the welfare of their fellow man without thought of personal gain can appropriately be honored by the bestowing of The Order of the Splintered Paddle.

Frank was a member of the Executive Committee O'ahu Development Council until 1983.

Frank won the Aloha Week Golf Tournament Award—C Flight, Low Net. He became a life member of the National Golf Association.

1976

The Colgate University Alumni Corporation gave Frank the Alumni Award for Distinguished Service to Colgate.

He was president of The Kamphaneha Schools for 10 years ... from 1923 to 1934. Ouring this time, academic standards inproved and the campus was relocated -- from the Bishop Museun prounds to Kapalama Heights.

Inroughout his career. Mr. Nidkiff has premoted the perpetuation of Hawaiian culture and componetrated his belief in the dignity of the Hawailan people. As trustee, he has supported Kamehaneha's growth: campus programs--from serving 370 students in 1939 to 2.600 today: Extension Education Division-established in 1962 to provide educational services to thousands of part-Hawaiian young people unable to be accommodated in the Schools campus programs.

In addition to his service to the Pawaiian people, Mr. Midkiff has been active in computity affairs. He is senter trustee of the Charles R. Bissop Trust, first hospitary member of the Dishop Muscum Corporation, and a trustee of Punahow School. He has been a founder of several provinizations, including the Heward National Guard's first company of Americans of Japanese Ancestry in 1917 and the first of Hawain's companies associations. He has served as trustee of the Sishop Museum, president and executive vice-president of the Henolulu Enanber of Commerce, civilian aide to the Secretary of the Army for Howall, secretary and president of the Social Science Association of Honobulu, High Commissioner of the Trust Territory of the Pacific, and honorary Danish Consul. a position for which he was knighted by Dermark's King Frederick 1x. In addition, he helped establish the Frederick Duclos Barstow Foundation for American Sampans. Under Mr. Ridkiff's guidance, this Foundation has built a private school for boys and established a teacher-training institute.

It is in Annor of Frenk E. Midkiff, distinguished educator and civic leader, that the learning center is named.



A learning center is more than a library. It bouses printed materials - books, pan-phicts and periodicals, and audio visual materials - filmstrips, recordings and the equipment meeded to use them. It has pecial areas for study and discussion. It contains space and equipment for pre-paring presentations that include posters, charts, photographs, and recordings as vell as written information. Most impor-tant, a bearning coreer is scaffed with people who can provide assistance to stu-cents and teachers in finding and using materials effectively.

These coscepts were first put into prac-tice at the Kanebaseha Schools Elementary Division in 1957 with the opening of Kanmalu and its lerning center. Next, in 1970, the library at the Internediate Division was renovated to become a Learn-ing center with adecuate space for nate-rials, equipment are study. The opening of the Frank E. Midkiff tharning Learner completes the final stage of providing learning center facilities for students throughout the capus program.

Need

the need for a single facility on the migh school compus to house books and other instructional materials became ap-parent is 1965 with the introduction of coeducation. Neither of the libraries -one on upper cambus and the other on the lower - vas adequate; each with limited reading and storage areas. Also, recent

years have broughs changes in the use of deucational technology, particularly television and other visual means of com-munication.

Facilities

The Frank S. Midkiff Learning Center is designed to nuet these sends now and in the forescalle future. Included in the building are a library with a consisy for over 55,000 volumes, a schedal room to house house on Hawaiiana, a television studio, an audio and graphics center and areas for seating 700 students. In all, the building contains meetly 50.000 square feet of work and study space.

Services, Materials and Equipment

In addition, the learning center brings together services, materials and equip-ment formerly noused at various locations on campus. These include:

 video cassette Dlayers, recorders and monitors;
 projectors for Dnn and l6mm film;
 overhead, opaque, slide and alcon-film projectors;

 computer terminals;

Frank co-founded and became the first President of the Japan-American Society of Honolulu. He was President emeritus in 1977.

In addition, Frank joined the Board of Directors for the BOWFIN submarine and museum near Pearl Harbor.

Frank celebrated his 90th birthday on November 15.
