
CELEBRATING KE ALI'I PAUAHI




NEW ACTIVITY BOOK TAKES KEIKI ON A HUAKA'I

PUNA PRESCHOOLS UNITE FOR MAKAHIKI



Keiki from Pāhoa Preschool joined the keiki of 'Aha Pūnana Leo o Hilo at Ke Kula 'o Nāwahīokalani'ōpu'u in Puna, Hawai'i for a joyous Makahiki celebration. Excitement was in the air as keiki arrived by bus, participated in a heartfelt protocol, and toured the Nāwahī campus.

The games began with keiki in mixed kula teams rotating through engaging stations. They learned about the rising of Makaliʻi (Pleiades), listened to moʻolelo about life in the ʻahupuaʻa, and tried their hand at traditional Hawaiian games. With intense focus, keiki rolled the ʻulu maika and slid the moa paheʻe on the lawn, aiming to pass the targets with precision. The energy shifted to sheer delight during running races, with big smiles and laughter echoing throughout. The keiki engaged in friendly competition for the final game of hukihuki (tug of war) where kula took opposite ends of the rope. Our Kamehameha keiki showcased teamwork and determination as they pulled together to claim victory! IMMERSING KEIKI IN HĀLOA

At Kailua-Kona Preschool, E Ola! comes alive through engaging lessons centered around kalo. Keiki plant huli with 'ohana at drop off, fostering a deeper connection to Hāloa. Throughout the day, learning continues with circle time discussions on kalo, a creation story video, and handson activities like playdough poi pounding and kalo puzzles.

Keiki express their creativity through kalo-inspired artwork, displayed both in and out of the classrooms. A new innovation created by Kumu Kelcie Holmes (below), is a kalo scavenger hunt that combines active fun with counting practice.
